





Mixing skin tones

Start by mixing the first base color on the left using the formula listed. Mix a good amount of the first base color so you have enough to complete all the squares in that row. Next, work your way across the row by adding the appropriate amount of white or burnt umber to the base color and painting in the corresponding square. When you've finished a row, move on to the next base color. In the final row, mix your own skin tone and write in your formula. Be sure to only mix one base color at a time so that your paint does not dry out.
